I know that it is not advisable for you to expose yourself too much at this time of year when the weather is so uncertain & I thought that perhaps you might like some one to be on the spot to watch the operations for you, and get out some of the skeletons which I think will be found.

In Auckland last I got out a number of Angle skeletons at Mitham on the property of Dr. Bedder 2.C. which are very

interesting. I am glad to say there are some more left and we are going to resume work in about another month. Those we obtained were in a very fragile condition and I am now engaged setting them together. When the excavation is finished I think we will have a very good set of skeletons.

I dare say you would have seen in the last number of the Journal of the Anthrop. Institute the paper I had on some skeletons from Howe Hill Bona. They are very interesting but
