I return you Mr. Strelley's letter together with the form from the County Office - In the year 1863 no less than £1000 was without a Damage & Interest subscription raised for building one of Lord Rivers' schools of the living headed the list with £100, although a good sum more

Insured it was not sufficient
for the purpose, the County Office
therefore advanced the remainder
for which the Doctor had to repay
from the income of the Living by
yearly instalments, Mr Stanley now
wishes these payments reduced
from £10 to £6. 3.-1, at this
rate it will take 5 years longer
to pay off, but this cannot be done
without your written consent as
Rector of the Living I think although

only a small sum it will be
some assistance to Mr Stanley
as he is very poor & your signing
the form will not affect your
position at all or compromise you
in any way whatever.

I am going to Boston today
^{privately} to dispose of the allotment question
& in my return I will go to
Bromyard & Grantham
