get out to your diggings at Woodgate.

The skeleton reported to us the (not I have been able to recover since I left Rushmore and will, I believe, have an important bearing on Mr. Evans paper, being found at a lower depth ~~than~~ than his bronze vessels. The skeletons I believe, two skeletons buried in stone cists, but no measurements appear to have been taken of them.
