Attained from excavations made by Belgian Geologists and Archaeologists, securing their first-hand reports and examining the very carefully arranged collections of the contents of Belgian caves shown in the Natural History Museums at Brussels, Namur and Liege. I have been greatly helped in my task by several Belgian friends who have done a great deal of excavating work. I have recorded the results of the work I have done up to date in tabulating this information and discussing the historical results it involves in two articles, On Hunting as told in the Cave Deposits of the Ardennes, of which I ~~have~~ <sup>corrected</sup> the final part to the other day. They are to be published in the Westminster Review of May and June. I trust he lets us to consider till the want of space may oblige the publication of a post article to be delayed till June in which case he sends will be published till July.

In India where I spent a great many years of my life I was too busy with official work to take up antiquarian studies by my side in particular which I attained in

accordance with nature and in the liberty of leisure. But in the thirteen years I passed in the Highlands of Central India and Western Bengal I became most intimately acquainted with their primitive races and learnt their customs, their ways and modes of thought for which I saw them as an official but joined to their amateurish and rough or shooting expeditions with them. It was then that I first learnt that the primitive village was founded when I had been previously taught Europe <sup>and Asia</sup> to begin in the Neolithic Age but in India, <sup>in the Indus region</sup> for the primitive village is the first step of a country for the habitation in Carter of villages organised in the same way as the Indian communal village together with the brotherhood and members of the village prove and true and the reckoning of time by the year beginning in November with the Hindu days of the dead. The old Hallas Eve all soul's Day and All Saint's Day together with other common customs I have named together <sup>with</sup> before to make excavations in India such as those which have proved so successful in Assyria and Egypt but when these are now begun they will prove if carried on on the same lines as those of our Native to Egypt people as to reconstruct the primitive history of the land where the civilization of Assyria, Egypt and Greece began.
