In reply to your letter of the 30th ult., it is of course difficult for me to say anything about the flints without seeing them; but if you would like to send them on approval, that is frequently done by collectors and others, and no difficulty has ever arisen as yet. It would be desirable that you should state the price and ticket each object with the locality and if possible, especially the palæolothic flints, the deposits in which it is found. Without the locality and some indication of the position, palæolithic imple ments are of course valueless.
