Dear Sir

I am glad to be able
to report to you that the work
on the Pitt Monuments has
been finished & the men left
yesterday.

The two shields have been
securely fastened into the wall
with copper wire

The top of the big monument
has been reset & cramped into
the wall with copper cramps.

The head & hand of the principal
figure Sir Wolfe & the dress

of Lady Pitt have been reset
& now look as good as new.

A piece of marble which
had burst out owing to the
swelling of the iron cramp &
which had been lost has been
replaced.

The whole has been very carefully
cleaned down so that it really
looks very well.

In the course of the cleaning
two important discoveries were
made. One was a golden Hume
which fitted on the top of the
urn on W S Pitt's monument
& the other what resembles very

closely the drawing of a Viscount's
Coronet with a small gold Hume
above on the top of the arch
which surmounts Sir W Pitt's
monument. Both have been
securely fixed with a copper
pin in their respective places.

M Wheeler made a
cleaning of the coronet & I have
tried I will copy it. Perhaps
with your knowledge of such
matters you may be able to
explain what it is & why it was
placed there.

Again thanking you for the
additional security & ornament
you have given to the church
