Dear General Pitt Rivers

I cannot visit Tewkesbury
in that we have just found
an allusion to apparently similar
passage or trench to those found
in these fields in Lord Selborne's
book to White's History of Selborne.
After describing some sarcophagi
on Blackmore Ridge in which all

had also found near some ruins with charcoal calcined bones etc. he says
"It occurs to me also to mention in this place, though their origin & nature & purpose are obscure, that immediately to the S.W. of the fine Samuli or Blackmore Ridge, overhanging Woolmer Pond are a series of ancient parallel trenches, six or seven in number, of some depth They are certainly not the result of natural or artificial damage

and from their number & proximity to Packhorse they can hardly represent ancient tracks or ways. Whether they could under any circumstances have been intended for Military defences I do not know."
