SIR,

The International Geological Congress will meet in London from Monday, September 17th, to Saturday, September 22nd, 1888. We send herewith the official circular relating to the meeting.

We are desired by the Executive Committee to urge upon Geologists of the United Kingdom the importance of joining in this Congress, by becoming members, and, if possible, by personally attending the meetings. The Reports and other publications relating to the Meeting will be sent to all Members.

The Congress originated in 1876, at the Buffalo Meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. Three meetings have since been held, the statistics of which may be thus summarised:—

Many questions of importance and of general interest will be discussed at the London Meeting, but perhaps one of its most valuable features will be the opportunity afforded for personal communication with Geologists of eminence from all parts of the world.

As the Congress meets only once in three years, a considerable time must elapse before it can again assemble in England.

During the week following the Congress, Excursions will be arranged, particulars of which, with full descriptive notes, will in due time be issued.

The expenses necessary for the reception of the Foreign Members, and for the successful working of this Meeting, will be considerable, as the Subscription for Membership (10s. for each person) will barely suffice for the printing of the Official Reports, &c.

The Executive Committees of the three preceding meetings, held in Continental cities, received assistance from their Governments, from the State Railways, and from other official sources not available in England. The expenses in this country must be met by private contributions. The Committee will spare no pains in order to make this Meeting of the Congress a success, and it appeals with confidence for support and co-operation to all interested in the Study of Geology and the allied Sciences.

Should any funds remain in hand at the conclusion of the Congress, the money will be returned *pro rata* to the donors.
