Dear Genl. Pitt-Rivers,

I have consulted Jones's
book, but with little result. In the
time of Edward the Confessor the land
in Tollard was owned by Rogo,
Toli & 5 thanes. As Tollard gets
its name from Toli, Jones suggests

that Rushmore gets its name from
Rogo. But the old spelling of the
name you instance is against this
derivation.

Laverstock is spelt Laverte-stoche
in Domesday. But there is no
reference to Lormer.

Britford is Bretford the "Britons'
ford".

Has Wermere any connexion
with War-minster? The latter

is written Guer-(i.e. War-)minster
in Domesday.

I am leaving England for Egypt
on the 20th.
