And it is hereby lastly agreed between
 and by the Parties hereto that on proof
 of the expenditure according to the foregoing
 Rules being made to the said General
 Pitt Rivers or his Agent the several allowances

That he will cut down or eradicate all
Weeds and keep the Land clean and
in Husbandlike condition and if at the
expiration of his Tenancy the said Farms
Lands be not left clean & free from
Weeds and in good Husbandlike condition

The said J H Kendall shall be assessed
for such neglect and shall pay to the
said L R or his Incoming Tenant such
sum or sums of money by way of compensation
as shall be ascertained & fixed by 2 disinterested
persons one to be chosen by each party and in
case of their disagreement by a 3rd person to be
appt^d by such 2 persons before they begin to act.
